You can use the discussion points below each video as a guide to further discussion about being flexible.3. Help your child think of a sample problematic situation that requires some flexible thinking and describe an appropriate solution.

Have your child choose a conversation prompt and direct your child to ask questions or make comments based on your responses for 3 conversation turns.3. Take turns choosing conversation prompts and responding, using 3 different conversation topics.

For example, for an activity about staying on topic, click here: https://media.centervention.com/pdf/Conversation-Skills-Staying-on-Topic.pdf2. Read the instructions for the activity you chose. Note: The instructions are teacher-student focused, so adapt them for parent-child use.3. Download the worksheet and complete the activity together with your child, discussing the topic as appropriate. Conversation activities can be practiced at home or over the phone.

Explain to your child how the visual can be used to remind us to stay on topic during conversation. Practice having conversations and point to the visuals as your child responds, demonstrating if your child's response was off-topic or on-topic.
