	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Select a set (or sets) of cards that feature the sound(s) your child is working on.</li><li>2. Follow the directions to download and print the cards. (Note: You can also practice directly from the computer screen.)</li><li>3. Have your child say each word 5x and then use each word in a sentence.</li><li>4. For additional fun, cut out each card and hide them around a room for your child to find. After finding a card, your child says the word 3x before looking for the next one.</li></ol>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Select a wordlist with the sound(s) your child is working on.</li><li>2. Have your child read the list of words. (Nonreaders can repeat after you.)</li><li>3. Play Simon Says with your child and include directions for verbalizing some speech words. (e.g. Hop on one leg while saying the word "run" or Throw up a ball up while saying the word "car")</li></ol>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Download the word lists and select the folder with the sound(s) your child is working on. Print out the practice word list.</li><li>2. Prepare a die. Write down (or draw) a list of 6 actions your child will do for each number spin (e.g. 1=jump, 2=clap, 3=jumping jacks, 4=whisper, 5=shout, 6=spin around).</li><li>3. Have your child start with the first word, roll the die, and say the word 3x while doing the action. Then continue on to the next word, completing the word list in this manner.</li></ol>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Find the sound(s) your child is working on and print out the accompanying word lists.</li><li>2. Set a timer and see how many target words your child can say within 1 minute. Keep track with tally marks. (Or you can use a tally sheet, such as one available at the following link: <a href="https://www.teacherspayteachers.com/FreeDownload/Articulation-Data-Sheets-Free-Printable-3191776">https://www.teacherspayteachers.com/FreeDownload/Articulation-Data-Sheets-Free-Printable-3191776</a>)</li><li>3. Repeat 3 times. For each minute timed, encourage your child to attempt to beat the previous "high score".</li></ol>

Download the file for the Spin, Say &amp; Dot Game and print out the appropriate sheet with the sound(s) your child is working on.</li><li>2. Follow the instructions, using a die if needed. For an added challenge, have your child say each word multiple times, to match the die spin (instead of only once).</li><li>3. Your child can then color the sheet for fun.</li></ol>

Select tongue twisters based on the speech sound your child is working on.</li><li>2. Take turns with your child saying the tongue twister (s) 10x each.</li><li>3. Try some more difficult tongue twisters, such as those at <a href="https://www.smart-words.org/tongue-twisters.html">https://www.smart-words.org/tongue-twisters.html</a>, choosing those that feature your child's speech sound.</li><li>4. Challenge your child to make up a new tongue twister for both of you to try.</li></ol>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Select a game based on the sound(s) your child is working on and age level. Note: If your child doesn't read fluently, read the prompts or clues for your child during play.</li><li>2. As the game is played, your child should say each target word aloud during play.</li></ol>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Select a book to read together that features the sound(s) your child is working on. Consult the list for examples.</li><li>2. Read a book together, with your child focused on reading the target sounds correctly.</li><li>3. If your child produces a word or words in error, select one word per page to repeat aloud 5x.</li><li>4. For a bigger challenge, have your child summarize the story or parts of the story, pronouncing target sounds correctly.</li></ol>

Click on the "Artic Games" link and follow the directions to create and play a Go Fish game.</li></ol>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Download a drawing sheet.</li><li>2. With your child, think of practice words that include the target speech sounds and write one word into each box. Instruct your child to illustrate one word in each box. (Note: Use a word list from Week 1 if needed.)</li><li>3. Use this sheet as a practice sheet, checking off a square for every time your child says the word aloud. For added challenge, check off a square for every word that is used in a phrase or sentence.</li></ol>

Select a difficulty level and select "Human" for players 1 and 2, so that you can play together with your child.</li><li>3. Once complete, have your child read the story, focusing on articulating the target sounds correctly.</li></ol>

Prepare a word list of your child's target sound(s) from one of the previously mentioned sites, such as <a href="http://testyyetrying.blogspot.com/p/downloadprint-free-speech-articulation.html">http://testyyetrying.blogspot.com/p/downloadprint-free-speech-articulation.html</a>.</li><li>2. View the description, scroll down for the Free Printable Bingo game and print the game. Prepare the game, as described.</li><li>3. Play the game together and each time a number from your child's card is picked, your child should say aloud one word from the word list 5x. For an added challenge, each word should be practiced the same # of times as the number on the card. (e.g. 17 on card=word produced 17x)</li></ol>
