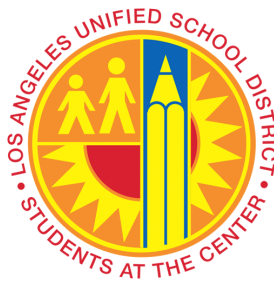


# LCAP @
