



The 5 Ways of assigning Magnet Priority Points



How are Magnet students selected?

Students may be assigned magnet priority points in 5 ways. The sum of these points is utilized in the selection process. Students are selected through a fair and secure computer process, based on verified information.



WAITING LIST

Applicants who remained on a valid on-time Magnet waiting list receive 4 points for the following year. Points may be accumulated for prior three consecutive years for a maximum of 12 points.



MATRICULATION

Applicants who have completed the highest grade level in a Magnet program and apply to continue in another Magnet Program at the next level.



OVERCROWDED

Applicants whose resident school is designated as overcrowded by L.A. Unified criteria.
Points not cumulative; they are assigned yearly.




PHBAO

Predominantly Hispanic, Black, Asian and other Non-Anglo Schools
Applicants whose resident school is designated as PHBAO by L.A. Unified criteria.
Points not cumulative; they are assigned yearly.



SIBLING

Applicants applying to the same Magnet school/program in which a brother/sister will be continuing.
Points assigned for first choice only.



Applicants will NOT be assigned matriculation and waiting list points at the same time.

POINTS

*Applicants may earn up to 23 points maximum.

Magnet priority points are only applicable to the Magnet program. There are no points given for submitting an application to a program for which the applicant is ineligible or for which the application is late. Students who apply for the same grade twice will not earn waiting list points for the previous year. It is the Parents'/Guardians' responsibility to verify the student's address, grade and ethnicity with the current LAUSD school of attendance prior to the application deadline.
