

Child Tax Credit Webinar: Frequently Asked Questions Responses from the IRS

Question	Answer(s)
We have not received the tax credit payment on a monthly basis yet. When does it start?	Advance Child Tax Credit installments payments starting July 15, 2021 and will be available through December 2021. Advance Child Tax Credit payments are early payments from the IRS of 50 percent of the estimated amount of the Child Tax Credit that you may properly claim on your 2021 tax return during the 2022 tax filing season. If the IRS has processed your 2020 tax return or 2019 tax return, these monthly payments will be made starting in July and through December 2021, based on the information contained in that return.
or I am receiving the 50% of 3000 and 3600?	Depends on the age of your children. For tax year 2021, the Child Tax Credit is increased from \$2,000 per qualifying child to: \$3,600 for children ages 5 and under at the end of 2021; and \$3,000 for children ages 6 through 17 at the end of 2021.

If the amendment changed the amount of your adjusted gross income that may have made you ineligible for the child tax credit. Please send me an email tomorrow so that I can get additional information, terri.malone@irs.gov</p>
<p>I have 3 grandchildren that I have legal Guardianship, ages 5, 6, 13 I am receiving 800.00 monthly into my account on July and September is this the correct amount? I didn't receive anything for August.</p>	<p>Hello. Based on the information you provided \$800 per month is accurate - \$300 for age 5 and \$250 each for age 6 and 13. There were some August payments that were delayed or mailed out. Please check the manage payment tool on irs.gov to see status of payments issued. https://www.irs.gov/credits-deductions/advance-child-tax-credit-payments-in-2021. Hope this answers your question.</p>
<p>I have 4 kids two 7 yrs and two below 7 yrs, but I receive \$1,050 is this what I am supposed to get?</p>	<p>If 3 of the kids are between the ages of 6 to 17 then you should receive \$750 and if the 4th kid is under the age of 6 then you should receive \$300 for a total of \$1050 per month. Hope this answers your question.</p>
<p>what happened if my kid just turned 18 this year</p>	<p>If you received advanced payments for your kid that just turned 18 this year then there is the possibility that the payments will need to be repaid since the child is over the maximum eligible age of 17 in 2021 if you do not qualify for the safe harbor. Please check irs.gov about how to reconcile advance payments received and the safe harbor rules. Thank you for your question.</p>

I have physical custody of both children</p>	<p>The advance payments are based on the 2020 tax return or 2019 return, whichever has been filed and accepted. Did you claim both children on your 2020/2019?</p>
<p>What is no longer available after Oct 15th?</p>	<p>The IRS non-filer tool and the IRS free file option will no longer be available after October 15th.</p>

<p>If me and my ex share custody and we claim our child every other year. If I claim my child last year and get the child tax credit but next year she will claim her how does that work for me on my taxes since I can't claim her next year from the money I have gotten past few months</p>	<p>The IRS will determine who receives 2021 advance Child Tax Credit payments based on the information on your 2020 tax return, or your 2019 return if the IRS hasn't processed your 2020 return. In other words, if you claimed the Child Tax Credit for your child on your 2020 return, then you will receive the advance Child Tax Credit payments. If your child's other parent claimed the Child Tax Credit on their 2020 tax return, then they will receive the advance Child Tax Credit payments.</p> <p>If you will not be eligible to claim the Child Tax Credit on your 2021 return (the one due in April of 2022), then you should go to the IRS website to unenroll from receiving monthly payments by using the Child Tax Credit Update Portal (CTC UP). Receiving monthly payments now could mean that you have to return those payments when you file your tax return next year. If things change again and you are entitled to the Child Tax Credit for 2021, you can claim the full amount on your tax return when you file next year.</p>

Do we still have to file our 2021 Tax?	Yes, you will need to file the 2021 Tax Return to get the other 50% of the Child Tax Credit.
Can I apply to the child tax credit with a ITIN #? THANK YOU.	Yes. You — and your spouse, if married filing a joint return — must have a Social Security number (SSN) or an IRS Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) to be eligible for the Child Tax Credit. You will receive advance Child Tax Credit payments only if you used your correct SSN or ITIN when you filed a 2020 tax return or 2019 tax return (including when you entered information into the Non-Filer tool on IRS.gov in 2020 or the Child Tax Credit Non-filer Sign-up Tool on IRS.gov in 2021). Advance Child Tax Credit payments will be made for each qualifying child who has an SSN that is valid for employment in the United States.

Once the account is created, you can request, in real time, transcripts of your account. The transcripts will show what, if any payments have been sent.
My dad put my children as dependents 2018-2019 taxes, he says he didn't receive anything, what can I do to recieve the money for my children?	You can file your 2021 Tax Return, next year, and claim your children.
Where can I find the link to opt out of the child tax credit?	You can go to irs.gov - select manage your child tax credit payments - then select manage payments option and enter information. However, the timeframe to opt out might have expired but please check first. Thank you.
Where can one apply for a irs job?	You can look for available jobs at irs.gov website. Thank you for being here tonight!
If I get welfare do I still qualify for the c.t.c. I don't file taxes and I haven't received nothing for my kids	You can still qualify for CTC however advance payments will not be made if there is no tax return information on file. We urge you to file a 2020 return or use the non-filer tool by October 15th. Thanks
am I able to apply for the child tax credit even though i havent done taxes in about 3 years ?	You must take action if you have not filed your 2020 tax return or 2019 tax return. The IRS has unveiled an online Non-Filer tool that will allow individuals who weren't required to file (and have not filed) a tax return for 2020 to file a simplified tax return. This simplified tax return will allow eligible individuals to register for advance Child Tax Credit payments and the third Economic Impact Payment, as well as claim the 2020 Recovery Rebate Credit. Your main home can be any location where you regularly live. Your main home may be your house, apartment, mobile home, shelter, temporary lodging, or other location and doesn't need to be the same physical location throughout the taxable year. You don't need a permanent address to get these payments. If you are temporarily away from your main home because of illness, education, business, vacation, or military service, you are generally treated as living in your main home. You — and your spouse, if married filing a joint return — must have a Social Security number (SSN) or an IRS Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN).
