For 29 years, the Sharing Brings Hope Consolidated Charitable Campaign has raised donations in your schools and offices. Every Spring, LAUSD's staff, teachers, and students, and their families contribute time, passion, and donations to the Sharing Brings Hope Campaign. LAUSD employees are generous, giving to organizations who really care about their students, schools, communities and the people who live in them.

The Asian Pacific Community Fund (APCF) is a network of 29 community organizations serving over 225,000 people annually in a total of 27 Asian languages plus English and Spanish. As the only Asian and Pacific Islander community-based fund in Southern California, APCF focuses on providing culturally sensitive programs and services to meet the complex and diverse needs of the Asian and Pacific Islander community.

Brotherhood Crusade founded in 1968, has been dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for families and youth throughout Los Angeles. We provide direct supportive services on many LAUSD Campuses to multi-cultural programs that address health, education, social welfare, economic development and youth development issues. We have **free after school programs on LAUSD campuses**, that promote health and wellness and enhanced educational opportunities.

Community Health Charities Community Health Charities is a nonprofit that raises awareness and resources for health and wellness by connecting more than 2,000 of the most trusted health charities across the United States with more than 17 million caring employees through workplace giving campaigns, causes, wellness programs, employee engagement, and strategic partnerships. The Kathryn Kurka Children's Health Fund provides glasses, dental care, immunizations and other medical care to LAUSD students with no other resources.

The LAUSD Employee Sponsored Scholarship Fund provides graduating seniors with financial assistance that allows them to enter colleges and universities.

The L.A. Trust for Children's Health is the 501(C)3 non-profit that supports all of LAUSD's school health programs, including providing crucial support to the district's school-based Wellness Centers, developing a district-wide oral health initiative and advancing school health policy both at the local and state-wide levels.

United Latinx Fund (ULF) funds programs that serve the Latino community in the areas of education-in-particular non-profit organizations that offer after school activities that help keep youth safe and healthy; and health & wellness- particularly funding organizations that are helping to prevent diabetes, obesity, and heart disease in the Latino community.

United Negro College Fund is the nation's oldest and most successful minority higher education assistance organization. UNCF awards more financial assistance to African American students than any other entity beside the government.

United Teacher's Educational Foundation prepares, trains, and guarantees that teachers have the skills to best instruct their students.
