

Overview

The Roadtrip Nation interview archive is a digital career exploration tool that enables students to discover new pathways, interests, and ambitions. The archive includes more than 3,500 full-length video interviews chronicling the diverse personal stories of leaders who have turned their interests into their life's work.

Interviews are conducted by young people who have candid conversations with leaders about their successes and failures and how they were able to navigate life's many challenges to pursue endeavors that matter to them. By hearing how successful people overcame challenges, students can learn from leaders and apply those insights to their own lives.

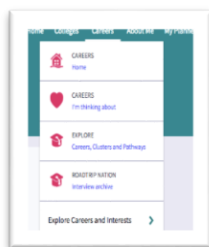
The archive helps students to:

- Take ownership of their own learning experiences through self-directed exploration.
- Develop greater engagement by discovering exciting opportunities for their futures.

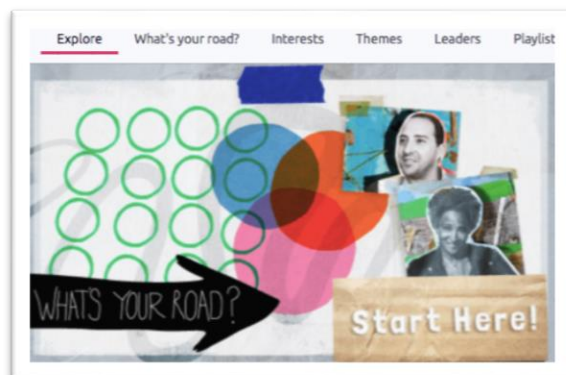
Accessing RoadTrip Nation

The RoadTrip Nation interview archive is located in Naviance Student.

Students can access the archive by logging into Naviance Student and going to Careers.



From here, students can RoadTrip Nation to search the interview archive.



There are five search options.

What's Your Road? – Students find their road with the What's Your Road? feature by choosing a foundation and two interests. Then, the What's Your Road? feature will match the student with leaders with similar roads to their own.

By playlist – Students choose a pre-assembled playlist consisting of video interviews from leaders.

By interests – Students choose from the listed interest categories (e.g. medicine, art, business) and explore interviews in fields that align with their interests.

By themes – Students choose from the listed themes (e.g. risk, failure, determination) in which leaders specifically address their own trials and learning related to the particular theme.

By leaders – Students choose from all the leaders interviewed and can filter the list as needed.
