Why are both dramatic and technical elements important in a critique?

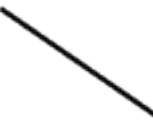
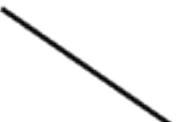
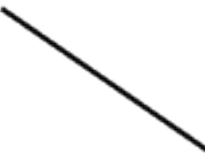
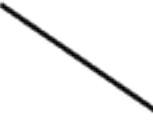
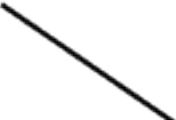
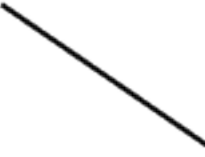
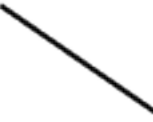
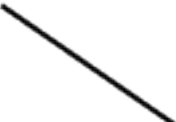
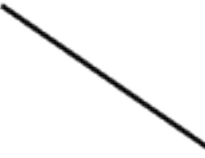
