8. Past Tense Marker (use wen, pau, bin before the verb)	Hu <u>wen</u> do <u>dat</u> ?	Who <u>did</u> that?
9. Auxiliary Verbs (use stay for – ing)	Wat yu ste it?	What are you eating?
10. Future Marker	I g <u>on bai</u> wan <u>ka</u> .	I'm <u>going</u> to buy a car.
11. Indefinite article	<u>Ai</u> l <u>aik</u> buy <u>wan dawg</u> .	<u>I want</u> to buy <u>a</u> dog

16. Multifunctional Words (da	All da trees <u>dat</u> no give good	The cut down all the trees that
